
Ski Industry Day (Grades 6-8)



Give your students a behind-the-scenes look at what keeps a ski resort running! This interactive field trip introduces students grades 6-8 to the ski industry with engaging demonstrations and hands-on activities from departments like Ski Patrol, Lift Maintenance, and Snow Grooming. From learning how lifts are maintained to seeing how snowcats shape the slopes and how ski patrol mitigates avalanches, students will gain insight into the teamwork, technology, and problem-solving that power the mountain every day.

Ski/Snowboard Lesson (Grades 9-12)



Hit the slopes and learn to ski or snowboard! Whether students are first-timers or already carving turns, this field trip offers something for everyone. With professional instructors, students can choose to learn the basics of skiing or snowboarding or build on their existing skills in a safe, supportive environment. From learning how to glide and stop to exploring beginner runs, it's a fun-filled day of fresh air, movement, and mountain adventure!

Snow Science & Safety with Ski Patrol (Grades 9-12)



Join ski patrol for an in depth look at mountain science in action. High school students will explore topics such as snowpack layers, snow crystal formation, snow friction, and avalanche safety. Using real SNOTEL data and hands-on field techniques, students will analyze snow conditions and learn how science supports decision making on the mountain. This unique experience combines applied physics, earth science, and outdoor safety in a world environment.

Sustainability (Grade 9-12)



High school students will explore real world environmental challenges through field-based learning at Mt. Rose. These trips examine changes in ecosystem populations over time, exploring the causes and impacts through the lens of sustainability. Topics include climate change, carbon cycling, and how human activities impact natural systems. Students will use local data and observation to investigate how the resort manages its ecological footprint and adapts to a changing climate. These trips encourage critical thinking, scientific inquiry, and environmental responsibility.

Depending on the season and mountain conditions, students may observe in-shop repairs or on-hill maintenance operations.
